We are a safe haven for animals to live the last days of their lives to the fullest in peace and harmony without fear or neglect.</p>	<p>Monthly Animal Medications Many of our horses, donkeys, and mules require daily medications and these are a handful of the medications that we use on a daily basis. These medications provide them a reprieve from medical ailments. Donations of up to \$1,000 could cover be used toward this cost.</p>	<p>Equine Nutritional Needs - Hay and Grain We typically purchase 30 small and 20 large bales of hay a month to feed our animals. Donations of \$1,000-\$3,000 could offset this cost.</p>	<p>Portable Chute and Medical Stall We are interested in purchasing a chute system and building a medical stall that we can safely provide medical care to our frequently handled as well as our unhandled / wild animals. Not only will this help provide us with a safe medical system, but we will offer it to other equine rescues and the public as well so they can be safe while providing better medical care for their animals as well. Chutes range from \$50,000 to \$80,000.</p>

By having 3 of these large walk in cages, our fosters are able to treat and socialize the kittens much better. The cages are large enough for the foster to interact with the kittens. The kittens are able to have toys, beds and litter boxes instead of being cramped into a small cage. We need three kennels at \$350/each.</p>	<p>Metal Roof For Feral Cat Enclosure We have a large feral enclosure that is home to all the feral cats living on the property. We need a roof. Currently, the roof is made of trusses and wire. Every year we have a large custom tarp we put on for the winter. We would love to put a permanent roof up.
